



“Will climate change affect children's rights?”

COP26: 100,000 voices heard

In the run up to **COP26** in Glasgow in November, we are working with **UNICEF UK** to explore with children climate change and its effect on their rights.

There will be a package of resources to facilitate a debate at Primary, Secondary and 16+ level, and the chance for children and young people to vote and comment on the question; **“Will climate change affect children's rights?”**

Included in the pack will be resources for an assembly, a tutor lesson, a longer PSHE lesson, or a whole afternoon of 'drop down' activities.

We aim to get 100,000 children's voices heard, not just here in the UK; but, thanks to British Council, from across the world.

We will then work with UNICEF UK to make sure these comments are heard at the highest level - and feedback to the voters about the impact they have had.
