

MANY THOUGHT THAT ANONYMOUS WAYS OF REPORTING BULLYING WORKED BEST TO AVOID BEING ACCUSED OF "SNITCHING".



Anti-Bullying Lead: a member of school staff who is responsible for a whole-school approach to bullying.

90% OF PRIMARY ATTENDEES AND 80% OF SECONDARY FELT THAT AN ANTI-BULLYING LEAD IN SCHOOLS WAS A GOOD IDEA.
